This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

April 2023

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) recorded a 1.6 percent increase over March 2023 and was 12.5 percent higher when compared to the same month over the year. Responsible for this increase were monthly expansions in both its local component and imported component by 3.1 percent and 0.2 percent respectively.

Inflationary pressures from international prices (mainly for food and fuel) remained strong, with the imported inflation registering at 15.0 percent (from 15.1 percent) while average local inflation surged to 8.2 percent (from 7.5 percent) in the month under review. As a result, the **annual average headline inflation remained at double-digits** for the ninth consecutive month, edging up to 11.7 percent from 11.5 percent in March and much higher than 7.6 percent of the same month last year.

The 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' subindex registered a 3.4 percent increase over the month, reflecting a 9.9 percent increase in its local component due to higher prices for fish, stable food crops (such as taro, taamu and banana) and vegetables (Chinese and round cabbages and cucumbers). Likewise, its imported component also edged up by 0.4 percent reflected higher prices for flour, turkey wings, vermicelli and potatoes to name a few.

Likewise, the 'Recreation and culture' and 'Clothing and footwear' sub-indices grew by 2.5 percent and 0.6 percent respectively. The former was due to a hike in its imported component by 2.7 percent (from a higher cost for television) while the latter resulted from 0.6 percent increases in both its local and imported

components (attributed to higher prices for jandals and floral fabric respectively).

The 'Transport' sub-index also grew by 1.0 percent driven by a 1.5 percent jump in its imported component (mainly due to higher prices for petrol and used Toyota corolla car) whereas the local component was unchanged from the previous month.

The 'Miscellaneous goods and services' and 'Furnishings, household equipment and maintenance' sub-indices both edged up by 0.1 percent each in the month under review. The expansion in the former reflected a 0.2 percent increase in its imported component (mainly from higher cost for hair gel products) while the latter reflected a 0.1 percent rise in its imported component as a result of higher prices for mattresses and refrigerators.

In contrast, the 'Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco' sub-index narrowed by 1.4 percent highlighting a reduction in prices of imported packets of tobacco.

The 'Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels', 'Communication', 'Restaurants', 'Education' and 'Restaurants' sub-groups remained at the same levels from the previous month.

The monthly **underlying CPI¹** edged up further by 0.4 percent over March 2023 and was 15.0 percent higher than the same period last year. As a result, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** also jumped to 13.4 percent from

12.9 percent in the previous month and was much higher than 7.0 percent in April last year.
