

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT FEBRUARY 2022

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.8: 2021/22

February 2022

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) rebounded by 0.4 percent in February 2022 due to increases in both its imported and local components by 0.7 percent and 0.2 percent respectively. At this level, the headline CPI was also 9.2 percent higher than its level in the same month last year.

Strong inflationary pressures in the past few months from higher imported commodity prices, had seen the annual average headline inflation rate rise further to 5.7 percent (highest level since August 2012), from 4.5 percent in the previous month and -3.2 percent in February of last year. The main driver of the current hike was a 9.3 percent (from 7.6 percent) spike in imported inflation coupled with a further increase of 2.0 percent (from 1.4 percent) in local inflation.

Underpinning the overall increase in the month under review was a 1.3 percent expansion in the "Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages" subindex. This was underpinned by a 1.7 percent gain in its imported component (mainly higher prices for onions, potatoes, sugars, rice and to name a few) as well as a 0.3 percent hike in its local component (due to higher prices for round cabbages, fish, tomatoes, taro to name a few).

Furthermore, the "Clothing and Footwear" and "Health" sub-indexes both went up by 2.1 percent and 2.7 percent respectively. The hike in the former was due to a 2.8 percent increase in its imported component in light of higher prices of selected school uniforms (such as pa'ave and pocket sulu) while the latter was also due to a hike in its imported component (reflecting a 10.6 percent jump in the price of amoxicillin tablets).

Additionally, the "Miscellaneous goods and services" and "Furnishing, household equipment and maintenance" sub-indexes both edged up by 0.4 percent and 1.3 percent respectively. The former's expansion was solely driven by imported toiletries while that of the latter was due to increase in both of its imported and local components by 1.4 percent and 0.1 percent in that order. The "Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco" sub-index also registered a gain of 0.4 percent stemming from an increase in both its imported component (whisky) and local component (Samoan ava).

"Transport" contrast, the sub-index In contracted by 1.7 percent due to a 2.5 percent decrease in its imported component as a result of reductions in petrol and diesel prices by 3.3 percent and 3.1 percent respectively.

The "Housing, water, electricity, gas and other "Communication". fuels". "Restaurants" "Education" and "Recreation and Culture" subindexes continued to remain steady in the reviewed month.

The underlying CPI¹ also increased by 1.0 percent in the month under review and was 9.9 percent higher compared to the same month of 2021. Consequently, the annual average underlying inflation rate rose further to 5.3 percent from 4.3 percent in the previous month and was significantly above the -1.7 percent in February 2021.
