

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.8: 2022/23

February 2023

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) went up by 0.6 percent in February 2023 and was 11.8 percent higher when compared to the same period last year. This monthly result reflected a 1.6 percent increase in its imported component in contrast to a 0.5 percent decline in its local component.

After holding steady in the past 2 months, the **annual average inflation rate edged up to 11.2 percent** from 11.0 percent in the previous month and well above 5.7 percent in February 2022. Largely underpinning this overall increase was a pickup in local inflation (up to 7.1 percent from 6.7 percent) while imported inflation remained constant at 15.1 percent (from the previous month).

In terms of individual sub-groups, the 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' sub-group was the main contributor to the overall increase in the headline CPI, reflecting a 3.4 percent gain in its imported component (expansion in prices of chicken leg quarter, rice, milk and onions to name a few) whereas the local component fell by 0.7 percent in the month under review.

Similarly, the 'Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco' sub-group went up by 0.3 percent in light of the rise in local prices for taula beer and kava despite a 0.1 percent decline in its imported component.

In addition, the 'Furnishing, household equipment and maintenance' sub-group expanded by 0.6 percent due to an increase of 0.7 percent in its imported component (prices for yellow bar soap and eveready batteries). Similarly, the 'Miscellaneous goods and services' sub-group also rose by 0.3 percent due to a 0.4 percent climb in its imported component (particularly due to higher prices for toiletries).

In contrast, the 'Transport' and 'Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels' subgroups fell by 4.8 percent and 0.8 percent respectively. Contributing to the drop in the former was a decrease of 7.5 percent in its imported component (reflecting lower prices for petrol and diesel) whereas the latter was due to a 2.5 percent contraction in its imported component (mainly fall in prices for kerosene, paint and cement).

Moreover, the 'Clothing and Footwear' subgroup narrowed by 0.3 percent due to a drop in prices for school uniform and ie-faitaga. Likewise, the 'Education' sub-group noted a 12.0 percent decline due to a reduction in National University of Samoa's registration fees.

The 'Communication', 'Restaurants', 'Recreation and Culture' and 'Health' subgroups all remained stable during the month.

The monthly **underlying** CPI¹ increased further by 3.0 percent from the previous month and was 15.2 percent higher compared to February 2022. Consequently, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** edged up to 12.3 percent from 11.9 percent in January 2023 and was well above 5.3 percent in the same period last year.
