


PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT FEBRUARY 2024

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.


Report No.8: 2023/2024

February 2024

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased by 0.1 percent over the previous month and was 3.5 percent higher when compared to the same month of last year. Responsible for the hike over the month was a 1.7 percent increase in its imported component despite a 1.9 percent drop in its local component.



Despite the slight increase in the month under review, the annual average inflation rate fell further to 6.6 percent from 7.3 percent in January 2024 and was well below 11.2 percent in the same month of last year. This was underpinned by a reduction in both the imported inflation (down to 5.9 percent from 6.7 percent) and local inflation (down to 7.5 percent from 8.0 percent in January of 2024).



The overall increase in the CPI in February 2024 reflected expansions in the following subgroups:

- 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' (up by 0.5 percent) largely reflecting a 3.2 percent hike in its imported component (due to higher prices for chicken, raw sugar, rice, mutton flaps to name a few), which more than offset a 5.1 percent reduction in its local component (due to reductions in prices for fish, salted beef, kekesaiga, banana and coconuts to name a few).
- 'Alcoholic beverage and tobacco' (up by 0.3 percent) due to higher prices for local cigarettes.
- 'Miscellaneous goods & services' (up by 1.3 percent) following higher prices for imported products such as toilet paper and diapers.
- 'Health' (rose 5.5 percent) reflecting increased prices of imported medicinal products such as amoxicillin tablets.


These more than offset reductions in the following sub-indices:

- 'Transport' (fell by 1.5 percent) due to a reduction in both its imported component by 0.9 percent (as a result of lower prices of petrol, diesel, used toyota corolla car and used minivan) and its local component by 2.5 percent (due to lower average return airfares in the Apia-Auckland-Apia route).
- 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels' (fell 0.4 percent) due to a reduction in both its imported component (mainly kerosene, paint, cement and timber prices) offsetting the higher local component (higher electricity rates).
- 'Furnishings, Household equipment, and Maintenance' (declined 1.0 percent)

- reflecting lower prices for imported household products such as washing soap, mosquito coil and mattress.
- 'Clothing and Footwear' (fell 1.0 percent) reflecting a decline in its imported component by 1.4 percent (mainly prices for running shoes and ie faitaga) despite a 0.4 percent increase in its local component.
- 'Recreation and Culture' (declined 3.5 percent) reflecting lower prices for imported television.

The 'Communication', 'Restaurants' and 'Education' sub-groups remained the same for the month under review.

The **underlying CPI**¹ went up further by 1.6 percent over January 2024 and was 4.8 percent higher when compared to February of last year. However, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** fell to 8.8 percent from 9.7 percent in the previous month and 12.3 percent in February of 2023.

¹ Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
