

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT JANUARY 2022

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.7: 2021/22

January 2022

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) dropped by 0.4 percent in the first month of 2022, reflecting a reduction in its imported component (particularly for transport, housing water, electricity, gas and other fuels and food and non-alcoholic beverages subgroups) by 0.9 percent, which offset a 0.1 percent increase in its local component. However, the headline CPI was 10.7 percent higher than its level in the same month last year.

The annual average headline inflation rate increased further to 4.5 percent from 3.1 percent in the previous month and -2.4 percent in January last year. This was driven mainly by sharp increases in both imported inflation (to 7.6 percent from 5.7 percent) and local inflation (to 1.4 percent from 0.6 percent).

The performance of individual sub-groups saw the "Restaurants" sub-index jump by 6.0 percent due to an increase in price of meals. The 'Clothing and Footwear" sub index also increased by 1.3 percent over the month, in light of higher prices of selected school uniforms (such as pa'ave and pocket sulu); contributing to 1.7 percent hike in its imported component.

Similarly, the "Furnishings household equipment and maintenance" sub-group grew by 1.1 percent due to a 1.2 percent gain in its imported component (increase in washing powder and mosquito coil prices). Moreover, the "Miscellaneous goods and services" sub-index also edged up by 0.1 percent due to a 0.2 percent increase in its imported component.

In contrast, the "Transport" sub-index fell by 1.9 percent due to a decline in its imported component by 3.0 percent, offsetting a 0.3 percent increase in its local component. Mainly

responsible for this contraction were reductions in the prices of petrol, diesel and car tyres, by 3.8 percent, 3.3 percent and 2.5 percent respectively.

The "Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages" subgroup fell by 0.6 percent due to decreases in both its imported component (decline in prices of apples, ramen maggie noodle and canned fish to name a few) and local component (mainly prices of taro, fish and cucumbers, bananas, mineral water and Chinese cabbage) by 0.6 percent. Also, "Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels" sub-index recorded fell by 0.3 percent due to a decrease in its imported component by 1.1 percent whereas its local component remained steady for the month.

On the other hand, prices for "Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco", "Communication", "Education", "Health" and "Recreation and Culture" sub-groups were all the same as the current month.

The **underlying** CPI¹ contracted by 0.1 percent in the month under review but was 10.3 percent higher compared to the same month of 2021. Consequently, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** rose further to 4.3 percent from 3.2 percent in the previous month and was significantly above -1.1 percent in January 2021.
