

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT JUNE 2021

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.12: 2020/21

June 2021

The **Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI)** rose by 1.4 percent over the previous month and was 4.1 percent higher when compared to the same month over the year. Its imported component increased by 0.2 percent while its local component rose by 2.6 percent.

As a result, the **annual average headline inflation rate** rose for the second consecutive month, up to -3.0 percent from -3.6 percent in May 2021, but was much lower than 1.5 percent in June 2020. This was highlighted by improvements in both the imported inflation, rising to -4.3 percent (from -5.2 percent) and local inflation to -1.7 percent (from -1.9 percent) in that order.

The 'Household, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels' sub-index went up by 9.4 percent due to a 12.5 percent hike in its local component (higher price for electricity) coupled with a 0.2 percent increase in its imported component.

The 'Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages' and 'Recreation and Culture' subgroups both increased by 1.2 percent. For the 'Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages' sub-index, the increase came from a 2.8 percent hike in its local component (mainly reflecting higher increases in the prices for fish, taro and banana) while its imported component edged up by 0.6 percent. For the 'Recreation and Culture' sub-index, a 1.3 percent improvement in its imported component (mainly higher prices for television sets) was responsible for the overall increase.

Furthermore, the 'Clothing and Footwear' subgroup went up by 1.1 percent due to a 1.5 percent increase in its imported component (mostly higher prices for running shoes). Also, the 'Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco' sub-group rose by 0.1 percent due to increases of 0.3 percent and 0.1 percent in its imported (higher prices for cigarette and beer) and local components respectively.

On the other hand, the 'Miscellaneous goods and services' and 'Furnishings, Household equipment, and Maintenance' sub-indices fell by 1.6 percent and 0.6 percent respectively. Responsible for the decrease in 'Miscellaneous goods and services' sub-group was a 1.2 percent drop in its imported component (lower prices for toilet paper) while the decrease in the 'Furnishings, Household equipment, and Maintenance' sub-index was due to a decline of 0.7 percent in its imported component.

The 'Health', 'Transport', 'Communication', 'Education' and 'Restaurants' subgroups all remained compared to the previous month.

The **underlying CPI**¹ also rebounded by 0.3 percent over the previous month and was 1.6 percent higher than its level in June 2020. The **annual average underlying inflation rate** went up to -2.1 percent from -2.3 percent in May 2021 but was much lower than 2.1 percent in June 2020.

¹ Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
