

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT JUNE 2023

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.12: 2022/23

June 2023

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) rebounded by 1.8 percent over the previous month and was also 10.7 percent higher when compared to June last year. This was due to increases in both its imported and local components, by 1.9 percent and 1.7 percent respectively.

Despite the monthly increase, the annual average headline inflation rate remained stable at 12.0 percent from the previous month but was much higher than 8.8 percent in June last year. This unchanged level in June 2023 reflected a further pick up in local inflation (to 9.2 percent from 8.7 percent) against a reduction in imported inflation (to 14.5 percent from 15.0 percent).

By component, the 'Food and non-alcoholic beverages' sub-index bounced back up by 3.3 percent reflecting a rebound of 4.9 percent in its local component reflecting hikes in prices for stable food crops (such as ta'amu, taro and banana), bread, and fish pieces to name a few. Its imported component also expanded by 2.5 percent; mirroring higher prices for sugar, mutton flap, chicken leg quarter and rice to name a few.

The 'Transport' sub-index also edged-up by 1.3 percent due to increases in both its imported and local components, by 1.6 percent and 0.8 percent respectively. The former was underpinned by higher prices for petrol and diesel while the latter was due to a further hike in prices for the Apia-Auckland-Apia return airfares.

Likewise, the 'Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels' sub-index grew by 2.8 percent as a result of expansions in both its imported

component by 8.4 percent (higher prices for liquid gas and paint) and local component by 0.4 percent, (reflecting an increase in electricity prices).

Moreover, the 'Clothing and footwear' and 'Health' sub-indices both improved by 0.2 percent and 0.7 percent in that order. The former was accounted for by higher prices for floral-fabric material while the latter was due to an expansion in the price of amoxicillin tablets.

In contrast, the 'Alcoholic beverage and tobacco' sub-index contracted by 1.2 percent, reflecting a drop in its imported component by 7.7 percent (Winfield packet of cigarettes), offsetting a 0.2 percent rise in its local component. Furthermore, the 'Miscellaneous goods and services' sub-index shrank by 0.3 percent, highlighting a 0.3 percent drop in its imported component (mainly due to lower prices for toiletry products).

The 'Communication', 'Furnishings, household equipment, and maintenance', 'Restaurants', 'Education' and 'Recreation and culture' sub-indices all remained the same for the month under review.

The monthly **underlying CPI**¹ edged up further by 1.9 percent over May 2023 and was 14.2 percent higher when compared to the same month of 2022. As a result, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** accelerated further to 14.2 percent from 13.9 percent in May 2023 and was 8.4 percent in June 2022.
