

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT MAY 2021

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.11: 2020/21

May 2021

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose by 0.6 percent over the previous month and was 1.8 percent higher when compared to the same month over the year. Its imported component increased by 1.3 percent while its local component fell by 0.2 percent.

As a result, **annual average headline inflation rate** rose slightly to -3.6 percent from -3.9 percent in April 2021, but was much lower than 1.7 percent in May 2020. This was highlighted by improvements in both the imported and local inflation rate, rising to -5.2 percent (from -5.8 percent) and -1.9 percent (from -2.0 percent) in that order.

The "Transport" subgroup continued to increase, improving by 1.8 percent due to a 2.8 percent hike in its imported component (higher prices for petrol and diesel). Furthermore, the "Recreation and Culture" sub-index also recorded a 1.4 percent increase reflecting a 1.6 percent expansion in its imported component (mostly exercise books).

The 'Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages' and "Health sub-indices, both recorded gains of 0.7 percent hike over the month due to a 1.3 percent hike in both their imported components. For the "Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages" sub index, the increase was mainly due to higher prices for chicken leg, mutton, rice and sugar to name a few while its local component fell by 0.5 percent. For the "Health" subgroup, the rise in its imported component was accounted for by the hike in the price of medicinal tablets.

The "Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuel" subgroup also recorded a slight increase of 0.1 percent, which was due to a 0.5 percent hike in its imported component (mainly increased prices for paint and kerosene). Also recording a 0.1 percent rise was the "Miscellaneous goods and services" sub-index.

On the other hand, the "Furnishings, Household equipment and Maintenance" and "Clothing and Footwear" sub-indices both fell by 0.7 percent and 0.2 percent respectively. The former was underpinned by a 1.5 percent decline in the price of 'clothing chest drawer' while the latter reflected a 1.8 percent drop in the price of sandals.

The "Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco", "Communication", "Education" and "Restaurants" subgroups all had remained the same compared to the previous month.

The **underlying CPI**¹ also rebounded by 0.3 percent over the previous month and was 1.3 percent higher than its level in May 2020. Nevertheless, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** was unchanged at -2.3 percent from the previous month but was much lower than 1.9 percent in May 2020.

¹ Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
