

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT OCTOBER 2021

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.4: 2021/22

October 2021

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose by 0.7 percent over the previous month and was 9.7 percent higher when compared to October 2020. The current expansion was underpinned by an increase of 1.7 percent in its imported component while its local component recorded a decrease of 0.1 percent from the preceding month.

As a result, the **annual average headline inflation rate** edged up to 0.5 percent in October 2021 from -0.8 percent in the previous month and -0.2 percent in October 2020. This reflected further hikes in both imported inflation (up to 1.3 percent from -0.8 percent) and local inflation (up to -0.4 percent from -0.8 percent).

By individual subgroups, the "Communication" sub-index rose by 11.2 percent during the month due to an 11.2 percent increase in its local component (reflecting higher prices for internet). The "Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels" subgroup also rose further by 2.1 percent following gains of 2.8 percent and 1.9 percent in its imported component (higher prices for cement, timber and liquid gas) and local component (increased cash power prices) respectively.

Furthermore, the "Recreation and Culture" subindex increased by 0.8 percent in light of a 0.9 percent rise in its imported component (due to higher prices for stationeries).

Similarly, the "Clothing and footwear" and "Food and non-alcoholic beverages" subindices grew by 0.4 percent and 0.2 percent respectively. The increase in the former was due to a 0.5 percent hike in its imported component (due to higher cargo shirt prices for men) while the latter was due to a 0.8 percent gain in its local component (mainly higher prices for fish, bananas, coconuts and Chinese cabbage) despite a 0.1 percent reduction in its imported component.

On the other hand, the "Transport" and "Furnishings, household equipment and maintenance" sub-indices both recorded reductions of 0.7 percent and 0.3 percent in that order. Responsible for the contraction in the former was a 1.0 percent decrease in its imported component (mostly lower prices of diesel and petrol) while the reduction in the latter was due to a 0.3 percent drop in its imported component.

The "Alcoholic beverage and tobacco", "Health", "Education", "Restaurants" and "Miscellaneous goods and services" subgroups all remained unchanged in the reviewed month.

The monthly **underlying CPI¹** also expanded by 1.0 percent and was 10.6 percent higher when compared to the same month last year. As a result, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** also grew to 0.6 percent from -0.8 percent in the previous month but was lower than 1.0 percent in October 2020.

¹ Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
