

## PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT OCTOBER 2022

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.4: 2022/23

October 2022

After increasing in the past eight consecutive months, the **Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI)** contracted by 1.8 percent (point to point) over the previous month but was still 12.4 percent higher than October 2021. Responsible for this current reduction over the month were decreases in both its imported and local components by 2.4 percent and 1.1 percent in that order.

The annual average headline inflation rate continued to accelerate (but at a decreasing rate) to 11.3 percent in October 2022 from 11.0 percent in the previous month and was 0.5 percent in October 2021. This was driven mainly by increases in both imported inflation (to 16.6 percent from 16.4 percent) and local inflation (to 5.7 percent from 5.5 percent).

The monthly decline in Headline CPI was led by a 1.8 percent drop in the 'Food and Nonalcoholic beverages' sub-index over the month. This was underpinned by a 2.4 percent decrease in its imported component by (which was mainly driven by lower prices for chicken leg quarter, sugar and rice to name a few) and a 1.1 percent dip in its local component (mainly lower prices for fish, food crops and vegetables to name a few).

Similarly, the 'Transport' sub-index fell by 4.0 percent due to a decline in both its imported component by 4.6 percent (lower prices of petrol and diesel) and local component by 2.7 percent (reflecting a drop in return airfares for American Samoa and New Zealand).

Furthermore, the 'Recreation and Culture' and 'Health' sub-indices also declined by 3.7 percent and 3.0 percent respectively. The reduction in the former was highlighted by a 5.8 percent decrease in its imported component (lower prices for warwick exercise book) while

the latter was due to a drop in its imported component by 5.8 percent in light of a reduction in amoxicillin tablets prices.

In addition, the 'Housing, water, electricity, gas and other Fuels' and 'Restaurants' sub-indices all recorded reductions of 0.3 percent and 0.4 percent in that order. Accounting for the drop in the former was a 0.9 percent decline in its imported component (mostly lower prices for gas, kerosene, paint and to name a few) while the decrease in the latter was due to a 0.4 percent contraction in its local component (reflecting lower prices of local meals).

On the other hand, the 'Furnishings, household equipment and maintenance' sub-index grew by 0.5 percent, due to hikes in both its imported component by 0.6 percent (increase in washing powder and mosquito coil prices) and local component by 0.1 percent (mainly higher prices for clothing chest). Moreover, the 'Clothing and footwear' sub-index also went up by 0.5 percent due to gains in both its local component by 1.5 percent (higher prices for jandals and aloha shirts) and imported component by 0.2 percent reflecting higher prices for ie-faitaga.

The 'Miscellaneous goods and services' subindex also expanded by 0.3 percent due to a 0.4 percent gain in its imported component, reflecting higher prices for soaps and toilet papers while its local component remained the same for the month under review.

Prices for 'Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco' 'Communication' and 'Education' sub-groups remained steady for the month.

## Review of Price Developments October 2022

The monthly **underlying** CPI<sup>1</sup> recorded a drop of 1.2 percent for the month but was 15.5 percent higher compared to the same month of 2021. However, the **annual average underlying inflation** rose further to 11.9 **percent** from 11.4 percent in the previous month and was significantly higher than 0.6 percent in October 2021.
