

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

## *Report No.3: 2023/24*

The **Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI)** contracted further by 0.8 percent over the previous month due to declines in both its local component by 1.1 percent and imported component by 0.5 percent. Nonetheless, the headline CPI was 1.3 percent higher than its level in September 2022.

Consequently, the annual average **inflation rate declined further to 9.1 percent** from 10.3 percent in August 2023 but was higher than 1.3 percent in the same month of last year. The slowdown in the annual headline inflation was underpinned by reductions in both local inflation (to 9.0 percent from 9.3 percent) and imported inflation (to 9.2 percent from 11.2 percent).

In individual sub-groups, the 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages' sub-index decreased by 2.3 percent during the month. This was driven mainly by reductions in both its local component by 3.0 percent (reflecting lower prices for taro, fish, Chinese cabbage, and bananas to mention a few) and 1.9 percent in its imported component (lower prices for chicken leg quarter, mutton flaps, cooking oil and turkey wings to name a few).

On the other hand, the 'Transport' sub-index registered an increase of 1.3 percent, highlighted by a 2.6 percent hike in its imported component (reflecting both higher petrol and diesel prices) despite a drop in its local component by 1.3 percent.

The 'Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco' subindex also edged up by 0.3 percent following an increase of 0.4 percent in its local component (due to both higher prices for Taula beer and Samoan kava). September 2023 A hike of 0.4 percent was recorded for the 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels' sub-index, due to an expansion of 1.2 percent in its imported component (mostly hike in the price of kerosene) while its local component remained steady.

Similarly, the 'Miscellaneous goods & services' and 'Furnishings, Household equipment, and Maintenance' sub-indices improved by 0.1 percent and 1.1 percent respectively. The gain in the former reflected a 0.1 percent hike in its imported component (mainly soap and huggies diaper prices) while the latter was accounted for by a 1.1 percent increase in its imported component (particularly higher prices for bush knives and yellow bar washing soap).

In addition, the 'Clothing and Footwear' subindex went up by 0.3 percent due to hikes in both its local component (rise in prices for aloha shirts) and imported component by 0.2 percent (mainly pocket sulu).

Furthermore, the 'Recreation and Culture' and 'Health' sub-indices both recorded hikes of 1.2 percent due to a 1.3 percent rise in the former's imported component (mainly higher prices for laptops) and a 2.4 percent gain in the latters imported component (mostly higher prices for amoxicillin tablets).

The 'Communication', 'Restaurants', and 'Education' sub-indices remained the same as last month.

The monthly **underlying CPI<sup>1</sup>** also fell by 0.9 percent over August 2023 but was 2.1 percent higher when compared to the previous month. Likewise, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** contracted further to 11.4 percent from 12.9 percent in August 2023 but was at the same level when compared to the same month of last year.
