PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT MAY 2017

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.11: 2016/17 May 2017

The headline Consumer Price Index (CPI increased by a 1.0 percent due to a 2.0 percent hike in its local component while its imported component remained unchanged from the previous month. In addition, the overall CPI was 1.5 percent higher when compared to May 2016.

However, the annual average headline inflation rate remained at 1.4 percent from April 2017 and was well above -0.1 percent in May 2016. This expansion was underpinned by an increase in imported inflation to 2.9 percent from 2.2 percent while local inflation fell to -0.6 percent from -0.1 percent in April 2017.

By individual subgroups, the "Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages" sub-index rose by 1.7 percent. This was due to increases of 3.1 percent in its local component (mainly fish, Chinese cabbage, tomatoes and cucumbers to name a few) and 1.2 percent in its imported component (higher prices for canned fish, chicken leg quarters, milk and coffee). At the Local Produce Markets, the overall volume of supplies (main source of local food) rose by 2.5 percent, while the overall price index also rose by 11.0 percent due to strong demand.

Similarly, the "Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco" sub-index increased slightly 0.1 percent from the previous month following a 0.5 percent hike in its local component (increase in the price of Samoan kava). This was partially offset by a reduction in its imported component by 1.5 percent in light of Winfield tobacco and cigarettes prices falling by 11.1 percent and 0.5 percent respectively.

Furthermore, the overall "Transport" sub-group went up by 0.5 percent. This was underpinned by a

sharp increase of 4.9 percent in its local component (Apia-Auckland-Apia air fares up by 48.5 percent) while its imported component registered a drop 2.3 percent.

The "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels" sub-index expanded 1.4 percent due to an increase in its local component by 2.2 percent (mainly price of electricity-cash power up by 4.5 percent) while by its imported component decreased by 0.3 percent.

In contrast, the "Furnishings, Household equipment and Maintenance" sub-index fell by 0.2 percent due to a drop in its imported component by 0.2 percent while its local component remained unchanged from the previous month.

The "Clothing" and "Education" sub-groups both rose by 1.0 percent each while the "Health" sub-index went up by 0.8 percent. However, the "Miscellaneous goods and services" fell by 0.4 percent whereas the "Recreation and Culture", "Health", "Communication" and "Restaurants" subgroups remained unchanged from April 2017.

The **underlying CPI**¹ increased by 0.7 percent over the month was 1.4 percent higher than its level in May 2016. As a result, the **annual average underlying CPI** rose further to 1.6 percent compared to 1.3 percent in the preceding month given its imported inflation increased to 2.4 percent while local inflation remained at -0.2 percent.
