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PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT JULY 2017

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.01: 2017/18

July 2017

The headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased by 0.8 percent over the month but was unchanged when compared to July 2016. The monthly hike was highlighted by an increase of 1.0 percent in its local component whereas imported component remained stable from the previous month.

To kick start FY 2017/18, the *annual average headline inflation rate* fell further to 1.1 percent from 1.3 percent at the end of June 2017 but was still above 0.1 percent in July last year. Primarily underpinning this overall decline was a further decrease in local inflation to -1.3 percent from -0.9 percent in the previous month, while imported inflation remained constant at 3.2 percent.

Analysing individual sub-groups, the "Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages" sub-index increased by 2.6 percent. This was due to a 1.1 percent increase in its local component (mainly fish and taro), which went up by 25.0 percent and 23.7 percent respectively. Its imported component however, remained unchanged during the month, reflecting virtually unchanged prices for most of the food commodities namely chicken legs, turkey wings and mutton flaps to name a few.

Similarly, the "Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco" sub-index edged up by 0.7 percent compared to the previous month. This resulted from a 0.6 percent increase in its local component (cigarette prices increasing by 1.7 percent) while its imported component rose by 1.1 percent (due to a rise of 2.1 percent in the price of Winfield tobacco).

The "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels" sub-index went up by 2.0 percent, in light of a 3.0 percent hike in its local component (Rent – government house increase by 30 percent)

offsetting a slight decrease of 0.6 percent in its imported component.

On the contrary, the "Transport" sub-index dropped by 3.7 percent due to a 5.9 percent reduction in its local component as well as a 2.2 percent decline in its imported component. The former was underpinned by a significant reduction in the Apia-Auckland-Apia airfare by 37.2 percent while the former reflected a drop in petrol prices by 2.9 percent.

In addition, the "Miscellaneous goods and services", "Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance", and "Clothing and Footwear" subgroups all dropped by 0.1 percent, 0.2 percent and 2.1 percent respectively. All other sub-indices such as "Communication", "Education", "Health", "Recreation and Culture" and "Restaurant" remained unchanged during the month

The **underlying CPI**¹ increased by 0.9 percent in July 2017 and was also 1.6 percent higher over July 2016. However, the **underlying CPI inflation rate** remained unchanged at 1.5 percent as in the previous month but much higher than -3.3 percent in the same month of last year.

¹ Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
