

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT DECEMBER 2017

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.06: 2017/18 December 2017

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) contracted by 1.3 percent following consecutive increases in the past two months. This was due to reductions in both its imported and local components by 0.7 percent and 2.0 percent respectively. In comparison to December 2016, it was 2.6 percent higher than that of last year.

As an outcome, the *annual average headline inflation* increased further to 1.6 percent from 1.5 percent in the preceding month and 1.3 percent in December 2016. This result reflected the further hike in imported inflation to 4.7 percent outweighing the slowdown in local inflation to -1.3 percent.

By individual sub groups, the "Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages" edged down by 2.9 percent. The decline was accounted for by both reductions in its local component by 6.8 percent (mainly prices of fish and banana) and imported component by 1.3 percent (sugar, apples potatoes and butter to name a few). At the Local Produce Markets, the overall volume of supplies (main source of local food) fell by 15.4 percent, which pushed the Market overall price index up by 4.0 percent.

Similarly, the "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels" fell by 2.1 percent due to a 2.7 percent decline in its imported component (drop in electricity-cash power prices).

The "Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance" and "Miscellaneous goods and service" sub-indexes decreased slightly by 0.6 percent and 0.1 percent respectively. The reduction in the two sub-indexes was due mainly to decreases in their imported components in light of lower prices for mosquito coil and baby diapers to name a few.

In contrast, the "Transport" sub-index rose by 0.7 percent given increases in both its local and imported components by 1.0 percent and 0.5 percent respectively (such as the hike in petrol prices as well as the Apia-Auckland-Apia airfare to name a few).

The "Clothing and Footwear" sub-index edged up by 0.1 percent due to a 0.8 percent upturn in its local component. This reflected the hike in prices of puletasi dresses and ie solosolo offsetting a decline of 0.2 percent in its imported component (decrease in prices of men's shirt).

"Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco", "Health", "Communication", "Recreation and Culture", "Education" and "Restaurants" sub groups were all unchanged in the month under review.

The **underlying CPI**¹ contracted by 2.7 percent in December 2017 and was 2.1 percent higher compared to the same month last year. On the contrary, the **annual average underlying CPI** remained at 2.1 percent but was well above -0.7 percent in December 2016.

¹ Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
