

## PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT APRIL 2018

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

## Report No.10: 2017/18

The **Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI)** rebounded by 0.6 percent over the previous month due to a solely increase in local component by 1.7 percent whereas its imported component contracted by 0.4 percent. Furthermore, the headline CPI was 4.6 percent higher than its level in April 2017.

The *annual average headline inflation rate* inched further to 2.9 percent from 2.7 percent in the previous month, and was well above 1.4 percent in April 2017. Primarily underpinning this overall hike was a further pickup in local inflation to 1.1 percent (higher prices for Apia-Auckland-Apia airfares and electricity) from 0.4 percent in the previous month, outweighing a drop in imported inflation to 4.6 percent from 4.7 percent in March 2018.

By individual sub-groups, the *"Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels"* component bounced back up by 1.5 percent. The increase was accounted for by a 2.2 percent increase in its local component due to a 5.1 percent increase in electricity prices. However, its imported component contracted by 0.6 percent (mainly due to lower prices of kerosene, gloss paint and timber).

Furthermore, the *"Food and Non-Alcohol Beverages"* sub-group went up by 1.1 percent due to an expansion of 3.6 percent in its local component (increase in prices for banana, fish, taro, Chinese cabbage, matured coconuts, tomatoes and cucumber). Most of these crops were adversely affected by the Tropical Cyclone Gita in February 2018. On the other hand, its imported component declined 0.1 percent due to lower prices recorded for turkey wings, apples and sugar to name a few.

"Miscellaneous Similarly, the goods and services", and "Clothing and Footwear" subindexes, edged up by 0.8 percent and 0.4 percent respectively in April 2018. The increase in the former reflected a hike of 1.0 percent in its imported component whereas the local component remained unchanged for the past seventeen consecutive months. In addition, "Alcoholic and Culture" "Recreation and Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics" both expanded by 0.3 percent and 0.2 percent in that order.

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On the other hand, the *"Furnishing, Household Equipment and Maintenance"* sub-index contracted by 0.3 percent, reflecting a decrease in imported component by 0.3 percent whilst the local component remained unchanged. Moreover, the *"Transport"* sub-group decreased 0.1 percent following a 6.7 percent drop in its imported component (mainly due to reductions in petrol and diesel prices by 2.2 percent each) during the month under review.

The *"Health", "Communication", "Education"* and *"Restaurants"* sub-indexes were steady in April 2018.

The **underlying CPI<sup>1</sup>** fell slightly by 0.04 percent in the month under review but was 3.4 percent higher compared to the same month of 2017. As a result, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** went up further to 2.7 percent from 2.5 percent in the previous month, and was also above 1.3 percent in April 2017.
