

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT JUNE 2018

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

June 2018

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) went up further by 1.1 percent over the previous month due to an increase in imported component by 3.5 percent offsetting a 1.4 percent drop in its local component. Moreover, the headline CPI was 5.8 percent higher than its level in the same month last year.

The annual average headline inflation rate widened to 3.7 percent from 3.3 percent in the previous month, and was well above 1.3 percent in June 2017. Primarily responsible for this overall increase were boosts in imported inflation to 5.2 percent (from 4.8 percent) and local inflation to 2.1 percent (from 1.8 percent).

By individual sub-groups, the "Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages" component expanded further by 2.8 percent. The increase was accounted for by a 5.4 percent increase in its imported (particularly due to higher prices of chicken leg, turkey wings, pig trotter and devondale milk to name a few) despite a 2.7 percent contraction in the local components (mainly fish, Chinese and round cabbages, bananas, cucumber and tomatoes).

Also supporting the monthly increase was the increase in "Transport" sub-group by 1.4 percent due to a 2.6 percent expansion in its imported component (increase in prices for petrol, diesel, used mini-vans and car tyres) whereas the local component had reduced by 0.6 percent (lower price for returned air fares Apia-Auckland-Apia).

However, the "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels" and "Furnishing, Household Equipment and Maintenance" sub-groups, both reduced by 1.8 percent and 1.1 percent respectively. The decrease in the former reflected a drop of 2.9 percent in its local component (reduction in prices for electricity

cash power) offsetting 1.3 percent increase in its imported components (mainly kerosene and timber).

Similarly, the "Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics" sub-index contracted by 0.4 percent, reflecting a decrease in its local component by 0.5 percent (representing decline in prices for kava, taula and vailima beers). This had managed to offset a 0.1 percent increase in its imported component. Furthermore, the "Miscellaneous and Services" sub-group had decreased by 0.3 percent, highlighting a 0.3 percent drop in its imported component.

The "Clothing and Footwear", "Health", "Communication", "Recreation and Culture", "Education" and "Restaurants" sub-indexes all remained steady in June 2018.

The underlying CPI¹ increased by 2.6 percent in the month under review and was 5.8 percent higher compared to the same month in 2017. Consequently, the annual average underlying inflation rate climbed up further to 3.7 percent from 3.2 percent in the previous month, and was also above 1.5 percent in the same month a year ago.

¹ Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
