

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT AUGUST 2018

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) narrowed by 0.3 percent compared to the previous month due to a 0.8 percent reduction in its imported component despite a 0.3 percent increase in the local component. Nevertheless, the headline CPI was 4.9 percent higher than its level in the same month last year.

As a result, the *annual average headline inflation* rate rose further to 4.4 percent (from 4.2 percent) and was well above its 1.1 percent in August 2017. This was due to gains in both imported inflation by 5.8 percent (from 5.6 percent) and domestic inflation by 3.0 percent (from 2.8 percent).

By individual sub-groups, the "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels" edged up by 3.6 percent due to a 5.1 percent increase in its local component (mainly due to higher prices for electricity) while its imported component decreased by 0.9 percent (lower kerosene and house paint prices).

After a drop in the previous month, the "Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco" sub-group rebounded by 1.1 percent. This was underpinned by a 1.3 percent increase in the local component (such as prices for beer and kava) while the imported component remained unchanged.

However, the "Transport" sub-index contracted by 2.1 percent, reflecting reductions in both its imported and local components of 2.1 percent and 1.9 percent respectively. The decline in the former reflected a decrease in prices for petrol while the latter was accounted for by a drop in the return Apia-Auckland-Apia airfares. Furthermore, the "Recreation and Culture" sub-index fell by 1.3 percent in the imported

component, mostly from prices for exercise books.

The "Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages" component contracted by 0.9 percent. The reduction was accounted for by decreases in its local component by 1.9 percent (mainly vegetables, Samoan cocoa, taro and fish) and its imported component by 0.5 percent (lower prices for milk, sugar and chicken leg quarters).

Furthermore, the "Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance" and "Miscellaneous goods & services" sub-groups both fell by 0.4 percent and 0.2 percent in that order. The former was accounted for by a 0.5 percent drop in the price of washing soap while the latter was underpinned by a 0.1 percent decline in Diaper prices (Soft love).

The "Clothing and Footwear", "Health", "Communication" "Education" and "Restaurants" sub-indexes all remained the same in August 2018.

The **underlying CPI**¹ was unchanged in the month under review but was 3.1 percent higher compared to the same month in 2017. As a result, the **annual average underlying inflation** stabilized at 3.9 percent from the previous month but was well above 1.5 percent in August 2017.

¹ Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
