

## PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT JANUARY 2019

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) fell further by 1.6 percent in the first month of 2019, due to decreases in both its imported and local components by 3.1 percent and 0.2 percent respectively. In addition, the headline CPI was 1.1 percent lower than the same month last year.

As a result, the *annual average inflation rate* dropped to 3.7 percent from 4.2 percent in December 2018 but was above 2.4 percent in January last year. This was due to a further decrease of 3.4 percent (from 4.3 percent) in imported inflation whereas local inflation remained at 4.1 percent from the previous month.

The performance of individual sub-groups saw the "Food and Non-Alcohol Beverages" sub-group narrowed by 1.0 percent, due to a 2.2 percent decline in its imported component (drop in prices for chicken leg quarter, rice and milk), offsetting a 1.4 percent increase in its local component (higher prices for Samoan cocoa, round cabbage, cucumber and tomatoes to mention a few).

The overall volume of supplies (main source of local food) at the Local Produce Markets dropped by 3.4 percent, which led to a 16.7 percent hike in the overall price index.

Similarly, the "Transport" sub-group also recorded a decline of 8.4 percent due to contractions in both its imported and local components by 8.6 percent and 8.0 percent respectively. The decrease in the former reflected a reduction in oil prices (petrol and diesel) while the decline in the latter was accounted for by a large drop in the Apia-Auckland-Apia return airfares.

Moreover, the "Clothing and Footwear", "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels" and "Miscellaneous goods and services" sub-indices decreased by 2.7 percent, 0.3 percent and 0.2 percent in that order. The decline in the "Clothing and Footwear" was due to a contraction of 3.3 percent in its imported component (lower prices of school uniform and footwear items) and a 1.2 percent drop in its local component (mainly lower price for jandals).

On the other hand, the "Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco", "Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance" and "Recreation and Culture" sub-indexes all improved by 1.6 percent, 0.8 percent and 0.1 percent respectively. The surge in the "Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco" reflected an expansion of 2.0 percent in its local component (mostly hike in the price of Vailima beer and cigarettes) whereas the increase in "Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance" was due to a 0.9 percent increase in its imported component.

The "Communication", "Education", "Health" and "Restaurants" sub-indexes were unchanged in January 2019.

The **underlying CPI**<sup>1</sup> contracted by 1.1 percent and was also 3.2 percent lower compared to January 2018. Thus, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** dropped further to 1.9 percent from 2.4 percent in the previous month, and from 2.4 percent in January 2018.
