

## PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT APRIL 2019

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

## Report No.10: 2018/19

April 2019

In April 2019, the **Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI)** fell by 0.2 percent, following two consecutive months of increases. This reduction was in-light of a decline in its local component by 0.5 percent whilst its imported component rose slightly by 0.1 percent. However, the headline CPI was 1.5 percent higher compared to April last year.

As a result, the *annual average inflation rate* declined further for the sixth consecutive months, to 3.1 percent from 3.3 percent in the previous month but above 2.9 percent in April 2018. Largely underpinning this overall decrease were further reductions in the local component to 3.9 percent from 4.1 percent while the imported component contracted to 2.3 percent from 2.5 percent in the preceding month.

By individual subgroups, the *"Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages"* sub-index declined by 0.9 percent. This was due to reductions of 1.2 percent in its local component (mainly reflecting lower prices for head cabbage, tomatoes, Samoan cocoa and bananas to name a few) and its imported component by 0.7 percent (lower prices for chicken leg quarters, butter, canned fish, flour and sugar).

At the local Produce Markets, the overall volume of supplies (main source of local food component) rose by 15.1 percent. As a result the overall price index decreased by 3.3 percent.

Furthermore, the *"Alcohol Beverage and Tobacco"* sub-index decreased by 0.4 percent as a result of lower prices recorded for kava and beer. In addition, the *"Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance"* and *"Miscellaneous goods and services"* subgroups both fell by 0.3 percent.

On the upside, the *"Transport"* and *"Restaurants"* sub-groups both went up by 1.7 percent and 0.6 percent respectively. The gain in the former reflected an increase in its imported component by 2.9 percent (increase in petrol and diesel prices) while the latter was accounted for by a hike in the price of a 'chicken and chips' meal.

Likewise, the "Clothing and Footwear" and "Recreation and Culture" sub-indexes both edged up by 0.3 percent each reflecting higher prices for running (sports) shoes for the former as well as exercise books for the latter. Additionally, the "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels" sub-group edged up by 0.2 percent (mainly kerosene prices).

The *"Health", "Communication", and "Education"* subgroups remain unchanged in the month under review.

The **underlying CPI<sup>1</sup>** fell by 0.3 percent but was 1.5 percent higher compared to April 2018. In addition, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** further declined to 1.2 percent from 1.4 percent in the preceding month and 2.9 percent in April 2018.
