

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT MAY 2019

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.11: 2018/19

May 2019

The **Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI)** went up by 1.1 percent over the previous month due to an expansions of 1.2 percent in its imported component and a 1.0 percent hike in its local component. Similarly, the headline CPI was 0.6 percent higher than its level in May 2018.

The *annual average inflation rate* fell for the seventh consecutive month, down to 2.6 percent in May 2019 from 3.1 percent in April 2019 and 3.3 percent in May 2018. The current decline was underpinned by further decreases in imported inflation to 1.7 percent from 2.3 percent and its local inflation to 3.7 percent from 3.9 percent in the previous month.

By individual subgroups, the *"Transport"* and *"Education"* sub-indexes both increased by 4.5 percent and 3.8 percent respectively in May 2019. The increase in the former was accounted for by gains in both its imported component by 6.0 percent (mainly petrol and diesel prices) and local component by 1.8 percent (mostly Apia-Auckland return airfares). The expansion in the *"Education"* subgroup reflected an increase in secondary school PTA's registration fees.

In addition, the *"Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages", "Clothing and Footwear"* and *"Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels"* sub-indexes also registered gains of 1.2 percent, 0.3 percent and 0.2 percent respectively. The increase in the *"Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages"* reflected higher prices of local food such as stable food crops and vegetables.

At the local Produce Market, the overall volume of supplies (main source of local food component) increased by 2.0 percent due to strong demand and as a result, the overall price index also went up by 8.2 percent.

In contrast, the "Recreation and Culture" and "Furnishina. Household eauipment and Maintenance" sub-groups both declined by 2.1 percent and 1.7 percent respectively. The reduction in the former was due to decreases in prices for a television set and laptops whilst the latter was underpinned by lower; weekly rate for live-in babysitters, prices for Eveready batteries and Klin washing powder to mention a few. Additionally, the "Communication" and "Alcohol Beverage and Tobacco" sub-groups recorded slight decreases of 0.8 percent and 0.4 percent respectively.

The *"Health", "Restaurants" and "Miscellaneous goods and services"* sub-indexes remained the same in the month under review.

The **underlying CPI**¹ registered a 0.2 percent increase in May 2019 but was 0.5 percent lower than the same month in 2018. As a result, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** declined to 0.8 percent from 1.2 percent in April 2019 and way below 3.2 percent in May 2018.
