

## PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT JUNE 2019

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.12: 2017/18

June 2019

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) edged up further by 0.4 percent over the previous month due to increase in the imported component by 1.1 percent despite a drop of 0.3 percent in local component. Despite the increase, the headline CPI was 0.1 percent lower than its level in the same month of last year.

The *annual average headline inflation rate* narrowed to 2.2 percent from 2.6 percent in the previous month and was well below 3.7 percent in June 2018. Underpinning this overall reduction was a decline in imported inflation to 0.8 percent (from 1.7 percent) whilst local inflation remained the same to 3.7 percent when compared to the previous month.

By individual sub-group, the "Transport" component expanded further by 3.3 percent as both local and imported component went up by 3.3 percent each over the previous month. This was accounted for by a huge increase of 24.6 percent in Apia-Auckland-Apia return airfares, as well as 4.5 percent and 2.2 percent increases in both petrol and diesel respectively.

After declining in the previous month, the "Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance" sub-group rebounded by 2.4 percent due to expansion of 2.7 percent in local component (increase in prices for Klin washing powder and bush knives).

In addition, both the "Clothing and Footwear" and "Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics" sub-indexes, slightly increased by 0.6 percent and 0.1 percent respectively in the month under review. The increase in the former reflected a 0.9 percent increase in its imported component (mainly school uniforms, ie solosolo and long sleeve shirts) while the latter reflected

a 0.9 percent increase in Vailima lager beer prices.

In contrast, the "Recreation and Culture" subindex contracted by 1.2 percent, reflecting a decrease in its imported component by 1.3 percent on the back of 3.9 percent drop in television prices. Furthermore, the "Miscellaneous goods and services" decreased by 0.9 percent, highlighting 1.1 percent drop in imported component.

In addition, "Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages" subgroups edged down by 0.4 percent underpinned by 2.7 percent decline in local food prices particularly fish, round cabbage, cucumber and Chinese cabbage to name a few.

The "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels", "Health", "Communication", "Education" and "Restaurants" sub-indexes all remained unchanged.

The **underlying CPI**<sup>1</sup> rose further by 0.3 percent in the month under review but was 2.7 percent lower compared to the same month in 2018. Consequently, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** lowered further to 0.1 percent from 0.8 percent in the previous month, and was way below 3.7 percent in the same month a year ago.
