

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT JULY 2019

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.1: 2019/20

July 2019

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose by 1.5 percent due to increases in both its local and imported components by 1.7 percent and 1.4 percent respectively. At this level, the headline CPI was also 0.4 percent higher than its level in the same month last year.

For the first month of the financial year 2019/20, the *annual average headline inflation rate* contracted further to 1.7 percent from 2.2 percent in the previous month and was well below 4.2 percent in July 2018. Primarily underpinning this overall reduction was a further drop in imported inflation to -0.02 percent (from 0.8 percent) and a 3.5 percent in its local component, dropping from 3.7 percent a month ago.

In terms of individual subgroups, the "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels" subgroup went up by 5.0 percent due to a 6.6 percent boost in its local component (reflecting a 19.3 percent hike in the price of water). In addition, its imported component increased by 0.3 percent in the month under review.

Similarly, the "Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages" subgroup expanded by 3.2 percent due to increases in both its local component by 3.4 percent (mainly fish, taro, cucumbers and round cabbage) and imported by 3.1 percent (rise in prices of chicken leg quarter, flour, rise and apples to name a few).

At the local Produce Markets, the overall volume agricultural supplies (main source of local food) declined by 3.8 percent. As a result, the overall price index slightly increased by 0.3 percent.

The "Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance" and "Alcoholic Beverages,

Tobacco and Narcotics" sub-indexes edged up by 1.6 percent and 1.4 percent in that order. The increase in the former was accounted for by an expansion in its imported component by 1.9 percent. The increase in the latter reflected expansions in local components (up by 1.7 percent) mainly kava, cigarettes and Taula beer and imported components (up by 0.4 percent). In addition, the "Miscellaneous goods and services" subgroup increased by 0.3 percent.

On the other hand, the "Clothing and Footwear" and "Transport" sub-indexes both contracted by 3.8 percent and 3.0 percent respectively. Underpinning the decrease in the 'clothing' were lower prices of school uniform and ie faitaga while the reduction in the 'transport' reflected lower prices of Apia-Auckland-Apia return airfares and petroleum.

The "Health", "Communication", "Recreation and Culture", "Education" and "Restaurant" subgroups are unchanged from the preceding month.

The **underlying CPI**¹ edged up by 1.6 percent in July 2019 but was 0.7 percent lower compared to the same month last year. However, the **annual average underlying CPI** reduced to -0.3 percent from 0.1 percent in the previous month, and was well below 3.9 percent in the same month a year ago
