

## PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT DECEMBER 2019

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.6: 2019/20

December 2019

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) declined further by 0.9 percent compared to the preceding month. This was due to reductions in both its imported and local components by 1.1 percent and 0.6 percent respectively. In comparison to December 2018, it was 2.5 percent higher than that of that year.

As an outcome, the **annual average headline inflation rate** increased further to 1.0 percent from 0.9 percent in the preceding month. This result reflected the further hike in imported inflation to -0.7 percent from -1.2 percent outweighing the slowdown in local inflation to 2.8 percent from 3.1 percent in November 2019.

By individual subgroups, the "Transport" edged down by 3.8 percent. The decline was accounted for by both reductions in its local component by 7.8 percent (mainly Apia-Auckland return airfares) and imported component by 1.4 percent (lower prices for fuel and diesel to name a few).

The "Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages" and "Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance" subgroups both declined by 0.9 percent and 0.5 percent respectively. The drop in the former was accounted for by a reduction in its imported component by 1.5 percent (lower prices for chicken leg quarter, rice and sugar to mention a few) while the latter reflected lower prices for washing soap and futon mattress.

Furthermore, the "Alcoholic Beverage, Tobacco and Narcotics" and "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels" subgroups, slightly fell by 0.2 percent and 0.1 percent in that order.

On the other hand, the "Restaurant" subgroup edged up by 4.7 percent due to a 27.3 percent hike in the price for lunch meal.

The "Miscellaneous goods and services" and "Clothing and Footwear" subgroups also rose by 0.8 percent and 0.4 percent respectively. The gain in the former reflected an increase in the prices for toiletries while the latter was accounted for by modest increase in the prices of women's puletasi.

The "Health", "Communication" "Recreation and Culture" and "Education" subgroups remained the same in the month under review.

The **underlying CPI**<sup>1</sup> contracted further by 0.5 percent but was higher than December 2018 by 5.1 percent. However, the **annual average underlying CPI** hike up to 0.5 percent from -0.1 percent in November 2019 but was well below 2.4 percent in December 2018.
