

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT NOVEMBER 2020

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.5: 2020/21

The **Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI)** contracted by 0.4 percent over the previous month due to a 1.0 percent reduction on its local component despite a 0.3 percent increase in the imported component. Moreover, the headline CPI was 6.0 percent lower than its level in November 2019.

Consequently, the *annual average headline inflation rate* slipped further to -0.9 percent from -0.4 percent in the previous month (reflecting seven consecutive monthly reductions). This was due to decreases in both, local inflation, which contracted to zero percent (from 0.5 percent) and imported inflation down to -1.9 percent (from -0.9 percent) over the previous month.

By individual subgroups, the *"Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages"* sub-index declined further by 0.9 percent. This was underpinned by a reduction of 3.8 percent in its local component (mainly fish, taro, banana, cucumber and sausage to mention a few) whereas the monthly imported component rebounded by 0.6 percent.

Similarly, the *"Transport"* and *"Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & other Fuels"* sub-indexes both fell by 0.4 percent and 0.1 percent respectively. The decline in the former was accounted for by reductions of 4.4 percent and 1.3 percent in the prices of diesel and petrol in that order. The contraction in the latter was highlighted by decreases in kerosene, timber and cement prices.

In contrast, the "Health" and "Furnishings, Household Equipment & Maintenance" subindexes edged up by 1.9 percent and 0.5 percent respectively. The gain in the former reflected a 3.8 percent hike in its imported component November 2020 (mainly amoxicillin tablet prices) while the latter was accounted for by a 0.6 percent increase in its imported component (reflecting higher prices for washing soap and batteries to name a few).

The "Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco & Narcotics", "Clothing & Footwear", "Communication", "Recreation & Culture", "Education", "Miscellaneous goods & services" and "Restaurants" sub-indexes continued to remain steady for the month.

The **underlying CPI¹** increased by 0.3 percent but was 5.5 percent lower than that of November 2019. Nevertheless, the **annual average underlying CPI** slipped to 0.3 percent from 1.0 percent in the preceding month but was much higher than -0.1 percent in the same month last year.
