

## PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT MARCH 2021

This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.

Report No.9: 2020/21

March 2021

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose for the third month in a row, up by 1.4 percent due to increases in both its imported component (up by 2.5 percent) and local component (up by 0.3 percent). However, it was 3.5 percent lower than in the same month last year.

Nevertheless, the annual average headline inflation rate continued to fall to -3.8 percent from -3.2 percent in the previous month, which was below 2.0 percent in the same month last year. Accounting for this current drop were further reductions in both imported inflation to -5.5 percent from -4.8 percent and local inflation to -1.9 percent from -1.5 percent.

A 2.4 percent hike in the "Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages" sub-index was the main driver of the increase in to the overall CPI. This had reflected hikes in both its imported component (mainly chicken leg quarters, turkey wings, ramen and rice) and local component (mainly bananas, fish, coconuts and tomatoes to name a few) by 3.0 percent and 1.1 percent respectively.

The "Transport" subgroup also rose by 2.3 percent due to a gain of 3.7 percent in imported component (higher prices for second hand Toyota corolla, petrol and diesel prices) as well as a slight increase of 0.1 percent in its local component, (reflecting the normalization of car registration fees following the stimulus package implemented in May 2020). Moreover, "Furnishings, household equipment maintenance" subgroup also recorded an increase of 1.5 percent, which was mainly due to an increase of 1.7 percent in its imported component.

Furthermore, the "Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuel" and "Health" sub-indices reported increases of 0.4 percent and 0.3 percent in that order.

On the other hand, the "Recreation and Culture" subgroup fell by 0.6 percent, which was underpinned by a 0.6 percent drop in its imported component reflecting lower prices for laptops and television sets. A decline was also recorded for the "Miscellaneous goods and services" sub index (down by 0.4 percent).

The "Alcoholic Beverage, Tobacco and Narcotics", "Clothing and Footwear", "Communication", "Education" and "Restaurants" sub-indexes all remained at same levels during the month.

In addition, the underlying **CPI**<sup>1</sup> grew further by 1.6 percent over the month but was 2.3 percent lower than that of the same month last year. However, the annual average underlying CPI fell further to -2.1 percent from -1.7 percent in the previous month and 1.8 percent in the same month last year.
