

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT DECEMBER 2024


This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.



1. Headline CPI and Inflation

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) edged up slightly by 0.5 percent over the previous month, driven by a 0.5 percent increase in both its imported and local components. Likewise, it was 2.9 percent higher when compared to the same month in 2023. (See Graph 1)




However, the annual average headline inflation rate contracted to 2.2 percent, down from 2.5 percent in the previous month and significantly lower than 7.9 percent in December of last year. This reflected a reduction in the imported inflation (down to 1.9 percent from 2.4 percent) while local inflation remained unchanged at 2.5 percent. (See Graph 2)



This section decomposes the headline CPI in terms of its Food and Non-Food inflation components. Food makes up 40.4 percent of the total CPI basket while Non-Food is around 59.6 percent. Historically, the predominant driver in Samoa's CPI inflationary trend is food inflation, with some periods influenced by non-food inflation (which includes fuel prices).

While the Food Index rose by 0.5 percent in December 2024, the **annual average food inflation rate slowed down to 4.0 percent** from 4.5 percent in the previous month and remains significantly below 15.9 percent recorded in December 2023. The monthly hike in the Food Index was driven by gains in prices of imported food items such as soy sauce, turkey wings, coffee, rice and biscuits among others; as well as locally produced food items such as fish, eggs, Chinese cabbages, water bottle to name a few. Similarly, although the Non-Food Index edged up by 0.4 percent from November 2024, **the annual average non-food inflation rate eased** slightly to 0.6 percent from 0.7 percent in the previous month and 1.8 percent in December 2023. The higher index over the month was due to increases in its sub-groups, such as 'transport', 'housing, water, electricity, gas and


other fuels', 'miscellaneous goods & services' and 'Clothing and Footwear'.

1.2 Headline Fuel¹ vs Non-Fuel Inflation

This section breaks down the headline CPI in terms of fuel and non-fuel inflation. Fuel makes up 6.6 percent of the total CPI basket while non-fuel is around 93.4 percent, Historically, the predominant driver in Samoa's CPI inflationary trend is non-fuel inflation given its much larger weight.


The Fuel Index increased by 2.8 percent from November 2024, reflecting the current upward trend in imported fuel prices. **On an annual average basis, however, the fuel inflation rate** edged from -3.4 percent to -3.8 percent² in December 2024, which was slightly lower than the -4.7 percent recorded in the same month of 2023. This deflationary trend reflected the lower average level of fuel prices in the year ending December 2024, compared to the year ending December 2023.

Similarly, the Non-Fuel Index rose by 0.3 percent from the previous month. However, the annual average non-fuel inflation rate fell to 2.0 percent in December 2024, from 2.9 percent in November 2024 and notably lower than 9.4 percent recorded in the same month last year. This monthly increase reflects the expansion in prices for the 'Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages', 'Furnishing, Household equipment and Maintenance' and 'Clothing and Footwear' sub-groups. 2. Underlying CPI and Inflation

The Underlying CPI³ rose 0.1 percent when compared to the previous month but was 3.4 percent higher than in December of the previous year. Nevertheless, the **annual average underlying inflation rate** dropped further to 2.7 percent from 3.2 percent in December 2024, and significantly lower than 10.2 percent recorded in the same month of last year. 2.1 Underlying Food vs Non-Food Inflation The annual average underlying food inflation rate decreased further to 3.2 percent from 3.9 percent in the previous month This was also much lower compared to 13.0 percent in the same month last year. The annual average underlying non-food inflation rate also fell to 1.8 percent in December 2024 from 2.0 percent in November 2024 and was lower than the 5.7 percent in December 2023.

¹ Fuel includes unleaded petrol, diesel, gas and kerosene prices.

² Deflation is when the inflation rate is negative meaning prices are actually lower than the comparative period.

³ Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
