

PRICE DEVELOPMENTS REPORT JULY 2024


This report is prepared on a monthly basis using monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI) data from the Samoa Bureau of Statistics.



1. Headline CPI and Inflation

The Headline Consumer Price Index (CPI) dropped by 1.6 percent month-over-month and was 0.8 percent lower than the same month last year. This decrease was driven by reductions in both its imported and local components, by 2.2 percent and 1.0 percent respectively. (See Graph 1)




As a result, the annual average headline inflation rate declined further to 2.9 percent in July 2024, from 3.6 percent in the previous month, and significantly lower than the 11.5 percent recorded in July 2023. This level, which was faster than the forecast 3.2 percent, was mainly due to decreases in both the imported inflation, which dropped to 2.4 percent (from 2.9 percent) and the local inflation, which fell to 3.6 percent from 4.4 percent over the previous month. 1.1 Headline Food vs Non-Food Inflation

This section decomposes the headline CPI in terms of its Food and Non-Food inflation components. Food makes up 40.4 percent of the total CPI basket while Non-Food is around 59.6 percent, Historically, the predominant driver in Samoa's CPI inflationary trend is food inflation, with some periods influenced by non-food inflation (which includes fuel prices).

In July 2024, the annual average food inflation rate declined to 5.9 percent, from 7.7 percent last month and significantly lower than 19.0 percent in July 2023. This was mainly due to reduced prices of imported food items like chicken leg, sugar and rice to name a few. In addition, prices of local food items such as salted beef, Chinese cabbage, ripe banana also fell in the month under review. (See Graph 3)




The annual average non-food inflation rate rose to 0.5 percent, from 0.2 percent in June 2024 but lower than 5.8 percent in July 2023. The increase over the month reflected expansions in sub-groups such as. 'Miscellaneous goods & services', equipment, 'Furnishings, Household Maintenance', 'Recreation and Culture' and 'Transport'.

1.2 Headline Fuel¹ vs Non-Fuel inflation


This section decomposes the headline CPI in terms of fuel and non-fuel inflation. Fuel makes up 6.6 percent of the total CPI basket while Non-Fuel is around 93.4 percent, Historically, the predominant driver in Samoa's CPI inflationary trend is non-fuel inflation given its much larger weight.

The annual average fuel inflation rate registered at -4.8 percent, from -6.4 percent in the previous month. The higher average diesel prices over the reviewed period were the main factors driving this increase. Similarly, the annual average non-fuel inflation rate declined to 3.6 percent, from 4.5 percent in June 2024 resulting from the drop in 'Food and non-alcoholic beverages', 'Furnishing, household equipment and maintenance', 'Recreation' and 'Health' non-fuel sub-groups. 2. Underlying CPI and Inflation

The Underlying CPI² decreased by 2.0 percent over the previous month and was 2.3 percent lower when compared to the same month of last year. Consequently, the annual average underlying inflation rate dropped to 4.0 percent compared to 4.9 percent in July 2024 and 13.7 percent in July 2023. It was also lower compared to its forecast growth of 4.8 percent for July 2024. (See Graph 5)



2.1 Underlying Food vs Non-Food Inflation

The annual average underlying food inflation dropped to 4.7 percent from 6.1 percent in July 2024, significantly lower than 16.7 percent in July 2023. Similarly, the annual average underlying non-food inflation rate fell to 4.0 percent from 4.9 percent in June 2024 and well below 13.7 percent in July 2023.

² Underlying CPI takes into account the effects of both external and local pressure on prices for commodities that are not subject to extreme volatility and price regulations.
